

NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Manuscripts submitted for consideration should be presented in a double-spaced paper format and in electronic format (electronic file, CD or key), including the article and the fonts used.

Authors are required to conform to the standard abbreviations of the *Année philologique* and *International glossary of abbreviations for theology and related subjects* (S.M. Schwertner, Berlin 2014, IATG³).

System of references:

- First citation of books: D.D. Luckenbill, *The Annals of Sennacherib*, Chicago 1924, pp. 26-30.
- First citation of articles: J.-P. Rey-Coquais, “Notes de géographie syrienne antique”, *MUSJ* 41, 1965, pp. 213-235.
- Subsequent reference to a book: Garelli, *op. cit.* (n. 6).
- Subsequent reference to an article: Hackens, *loc. cit.* (n. 22).
- Repetition of the author: *id.*
- Repetition of the book or article: *ibid.*
- References to texts and inscriptions should follow the system of references in use in each language.

Citations in ancient languages:

The traditional systems of transliteration in each ancient language should be used (for Hebrew, usage of *Orientalia* is preferred); Greek, and eventually Hebrew, may be not transliterated.

Photographs, figures, maps and plans, should be provided in electronic format, with a presentation on a paper format. Or they should be provided on bristol board following the format of the series (16 × 24 cm); figure captions should be written under the photographs using a lead pencil.

Articles should include two abstracts in English and in French of no more than 10 lines each. They should also include two to five key-words in English and in French.
